 - How to set up the trial
 - How to teach the child
 - How to provide reinforcers
- Modeling how to implement the procedure.
 - Demonstrate how to teach that skills so parent can watch and follow you model.
- Observing the parent as they implement the procedure.
 - Watch take notes
 - Provide feedback on how they did
